## Ruahine Kiwi- Project Hits the Milestone of 5000 pests.

Ruahine Kiwi is a partnership between ENM's Manawatū River Source to Sea Collective and Te Kāuru Eastern Manawatū River Hapū Collective with the vision of returning North Island eastern brown kiwi to the southern Ruahine by 2026. We do this through intensive control of mustelids on a landscape scale, with our trap network covering 23,000ha.

Just over two years in the project has 1762 traps in position and has hit a milestone of 5000 pests, including 330 mustelids, our target species. However, despite the exceptional groundwork happening to ensure our rohe is Kiwi ready the future of the project may be in question from mid 2024 when current DoC 'Jobs for Nature' funding concludes.

#### How can I help?
