In just over two years Ruahine Kiwi has put 1807 traps in position and has hit a milestone of 5949 pests, including 371 mustelids, our target species.

Despite the exceptional groundwork happening to ensure our rohe is Kiwi ready the future of the project may be in question from mid 2024 when our current funding concludes.
