

### Celebrating Volunteering:

Jane Mooney- Te Whare Koha.

Helping people in the clothing environment is in Jane Mooney's veins, and volunteering at Te Whare Koha, the free clothing hub in Highbury, was a natural way for her to continue doing this following a 35-year span at Ezibuy. Officially she works 3 days a week, but often takes clothes home to wash and iron them so they're looking their best for display.

Anyone from the community can visit Te Whare Koha at 42 Pembroke Street between 9am-12 noon weekdays, to access free clothing, linen, kitchenware, furniture, and baby equipment. They also have a pātaka kai (community food sharing shelf)...

#### Welcoming a new member group

Welcoming our newest ENM member group <u>Butterfly</u> <u>Compassion Community - BCC</u>. Nothing to do with butterflies but an awful lot to do with compassion, upcycling and recycling.

They work alongside the incredible existing services in our community such as Women's Refuge, MENZSHED, the police, hospital, local kindergartens and other education and health services to offer complementary, caring services. # Environmental Initiatives Fund Large Grant Recipients.

The Environmental Initiatives Fund (EIF) distributed by ENM has awarded grants totalling almost \$50,000 to seven local projects in its 2024 large grants funding round. The fund is made possible in collaboration with Palmerston North City Council and focuses on projects that improve environmental outcomes for the city and its people.

Now in its fourth year of distribution the fund received 15 applications totalling \$139,000. Some new exciting initiatives were supported which included focused wetland establishment, a new community garden and a local school...

Pātaka Kai are a space for people to leave what they can (excess garden produce and food for example) and for people to take what they need. This is not an exchange system, nor is koha required. Pātaka Kai are open 24/7.
