Palmerston North Repair Cafe has been Launched!

Palmerston North Repair Café held its first event to enthusiastic community response on Saturday 24th of September at Te Manawa Museum.

Repair Cafés (RC) are a place for community to meet, connect and fix broken items, thus reducing waste going to landfill. There are 35 RC's around NZ the Palmerston North one being made possible by a groundswell of interest which ENM coordinated and made possible through a successful application to the PNCC Resource Recovery Fund.

18 skilled volunteers from organisations including Supergrans Manawatū, Menzshed and RECAP made 24 successful repairs of toys, books, furniture and clothing in what was a vibrant morning of conversation, coffee and connections. All repairs were completed alongside the customer as a means of educating and informing them on how to do this themselves. To keep kids entertained there was also a take-it-apart table which was a huge hit and which created conversations that 'we hope will sow the seeds for a repair mindset in the younger generation' Repair Café committee member Viv Aitken noted.
