
Our thanks to The Egg Project.

A new contestable fund for climate related projects aims to support and encourage community efforts to build resilience to the effects of climate change, or support the transition to a sustainable carbon neutral regional economy by 2050.

Horizon's vision for this programme is to empower communities to reconnect with an improved biodiversity. It supports projects that support connections between nature and people and projects that work to restore and protect indigenous biodiversity including those that support regeneration and continuation of mātauranga Māori (Māori knowledge).
