


# **ENM Pānui**

#### ENM 2023 AGM.

ENM held its AGM on 26th of October, celebrating the many achievements of our now 67 member groups throughout the year and the growth of our projects and initiatives by, for and about our environment and our people.

The event was attended by 50 people including 15 of our member groups, 7 representatives from both Palmerston North City Council and Horizons Regional Council, and 11 people linked to us through an interest and passion in kai security.
