Green Gold Enviroschools Accolade for PNGHS.

ENM was honoured to be invited to be part of Palmerston North Girls High's Schools (PNGHS) I celebrations for reaching their Green Gold Enviroschools status. This is the result of over 20 years of environmental and sustainability focus, and the dedicated work of hundreds of young women and teachers, in particular PNGHS ex teacher now Enviroschools facilitator Dr Heather Meikle. The school is the first in the region to achieve this accolade, which is the highest Enviroschools honour. They join 10 other secondary schools in NZ who have achieved this status. The school demonstrates a sharp sustainability focus which is clearly and intentionally interwoven through all subjects and spaces in the school. PNGHS have been a proud ENM member group since 2014.
