ENM's 21st and presentation of the 4412 Kai Resilience Strategy

ENM very proudly celebrated <u>21 years of communication</u>, <u>cooperation and collaboration</u> in the environmental sector last week in a memorable event that included a presentation of the Manawatū Food Action Network's <u>4412 Kai Resilience Strategy</u>.

The event was attended by around 60 people from all walks and times in ENM's history, and was an opportunity to connect, share memories, and enjoy. It was also an opportunity to recognise and applaud the tireless dedication of passionate people who have helped ENM evolve into the voice and the hub for the Manawatū Region with impact on thousands of people for the benefit of our environment. ENM's Communications and Events lead Helen King was thrilled with the turnout and the desire to mark the occasion, 'We had people who were there from almost the very start of the organisation to present day staff; the diversity of people and contributions in the room was humbling' King notes. 4412 Kai Resilience Strategy Lead Dave Mollard was similarly gratified by the response to the presentation of the strategy, which has the intention, through identified projects to address city wide food insecurity. Dave noted 'It was a wonderful opportunity to talk about the important work so many incredible people are doing in this space to help our community'
