A very sunny Tuesday 6th April saw 14 volunteers including Bunnings Palmerston North team members, Te Aroha Noa staff, local rangatahi and volunteers from the Manawatū Food Action Network (A collective of Environment Network Manawatū) working in keen collaboration to create a new growing space for Te Aroha Noa Community Services. Mathew Bary, Bunnings Palmerston North Complex Manager, said, "The team really enjoyed coming together with volunteers from the wider community to build four raised garden beds and bring the community garden to life for Te Aroha Noa Community Services. We look forward to continuing to support the great work they do for the wider community", said Mathew.

Palmerston North City Council kindly contributed compost to the event, Bunnings donated materials, garden tools and fruit trees and Manawatū Food Action Network coordinator Daniel Morrimire is keen to offer ongoing support to the project to ensure that the garden thrives and can help feed its community. Te Aroha Noa Community Engagement Coordinator, Ashleigh Couper says that the support from Bunnings Warehouse and the Manawatū Food Action Network will go a long way in teaching our rangatahi about growing kai and taking food from the garden to the table.

The 4412 Kai Resilience Strategy update

The strategy was recently accepted by the instigators of the work Māori Health provider collective Ora Konnect. The 4412 KRS is a foundation document to help reduce food insecurity in the area of Palmerston North defined by the postcode 4412. Along the journey of writing the strategy, MFAN discovered that Food Insecurity is not the issue, but a symptom of the deeper issues that divide our communities. However, if we create a robust strategy to alleviate food insecurity, it gives whānau the time and space to focus on overcoming the greater challenges they face. In the long-term people with access to cheaper, healthier food are better equipped to positively contribute to our community. Over 100 projects have been identified that will support communities in the Kai goals. The next stage is working on the funding for implementation of these projects. The 4412 Kai Resilience Strategy is a living document and will soon be publicly available for the community to share.
