The ENM Environmental Initiatives Fund Large Grants Round opens 1st Feb 2022.

The fund supports Palmerston North-based community initiatives that improve environmental outcomes. Small Grants (up to \$1000) and Large Grants (between \$1000 and \$12,000) are available for projects that align with PNCC's Eco-City Strategy priorities, and any identified priorities of the network. These funds have been made available through a Palmerston North City Council Strategic Priorities Grant.



<u>The Large Grants</u> round will be open from 1st February-15th March 2022.

Southern Ruahine Kiwi Habitat Restoration Project

It is great excitement that we inform you that the <u>Southern Ruahine Kiwi Habitat</u> <u>Restoration Project</u> has been <u>officially</u> <u>announced as one of the the five projects</u> <u>receiving \$7.2m</u> of Jobs for Nature funding in the Manawatū. The project is led by ENM on behalf of Manawatū River Source to Sea and <u>Te Kāuru Hapū Collective.</u>

Feilding Against Incineration

Recently formed group "Feilding Against Incineration" has serious concerns about BioPlant's proposal to develop a pyrolysis plant next to the existing waste transfer station just out of Feilding. This plant will likely have significant environmental impact and the group has concerns that local and regional council bodies will allow the plant to be developed without opportunity for adequate public consultation. Proposals and plans currently open for public consultation The future use of Huia street.

PNCC is promoting a local bill to amend the Palmerston North Reserves Empowering Act 1966. The amendment would bring Huia Street Reserve within this Act, enabling Council to sell the land in future.

The Bill has now been referred to a Select Committee, the Environment Committee. Written submissions from the general public to the Environment Committee close <u>on the</u> <u>18 February 2022</u>. Submitters can request to speak to this Committee. A report is due back to the House from this Committee by 8 June 2022. <u>Submissions can be made here</u>.
