APPLY NOW! The ENM Environmental Initiatives Fund Large Grants Round closes 15th March 2023.

The fund supports Palmerston North-based community initiatives that improve environmental outcomes. Small Grants (up to \$1000) and Large Grants (between \$1000 and \$12,000) are available for projects that align with Palmerston North City Council's (PNCC) Eco-City Strategy priorities, and any identified priorities of the Environment Network Manawatū. This funding has been made possible by PNCC.

Open year round for small grants of up to \$1000 Open 1st February -15th March for Large Grants.

The Recreational Path Fund Application.

The Te Ahu a Turanga: Manawatū Tararua Highway Project includes a Shared Use Path that runs the length of the new road and provides a new pedestrian and cycle connection between Ashhurst (Cambridge Avenue) and Woodville (Hampson Street).Waka Kotahi has made funding available through the Recreational Paths Fund for community groups or organisations that want to complement the path by adding other trails that provide access for recreational users. The fund will be available until March 2025, if not awarded prior.

PNCC Resource Recovery Fund

The fund is available to projects that promote or contribute to reducing, reusing, and recycling items, with an overall goal of reducing the amount of waste ending up in landfill. Applications that help reduce the amount of waste going to landfill, education programmes, community events, trials and pilot programmes, and research and development projects are all eligible to apply for funding grants of between \$2,500 and \$15,000. Open from now until 31st March 2023.
