Future Living Skills - Sustainable Living



The key takeaways:

- 1. The importance of reducing moisture in the home at the source as much as possible. Use strong extraction fans in bathrooms, fix cracks in window seals, and use dehumidifiers.
- 2. Keep the heat in with a thermal envelope, including lined curtains that go all the way to the floor well past the windowsill.

On that topic, Rowena advised that the Red Cross Curtain Bank can make lined curtains to fit for people with a community services card (you will need to measure your window space first).

Our local Curtain Bank is located at 24B Domain Street, Palmerston North. They can be contacted by phone at 021 143 3800 or by email at manawatu@redcross.org.nz. They are open Wednesday and Friday from 10am to 2pm. It is advisable to contact them first to check the current availability of curtains and their process.
