WHATS HAPPENING

City to Sea Rail Trail Manawatu has joined ENM's network!



Their vision is to be a 'Great Trail' within Manawatu's interconnecting off-trail network. They are repurposing the old Foxton Railway line into a rail trail. This will run between Longburn and Himatangi Beach, and down to Foxton village. They meet at the Rangiotu Hall on the second Wednesday of every second month (Jan, Mar, May, July, Sept, and Nov) and have regular working bees on SH 56 or at Longburn. This includes removing debris, branches, trees, weeds, and mowing, then using old metal to fill holes and level the trail for track development.

Foxton's Dune Garden Rare Sighting



On Sunday, Arnim's team explored Foxton's Lupin Dune and nearby areas, making notable discoveries. Two Autetaranga plants were found with rare berries, and the Dune Garden continues to thrive with many new seedlings. Tataraheke plants were abundant, and Lupin Dune's seedbank was a key focus, with some pleasant surprises elsewhere.

A standout moment of the day was the discovery of new katipo sightings. The team found several katipo spiders, with one particularly notable observation being the first time the species had been seen in propagation, a rare and exciting occurrence. This marks a significant milestone, as it's believed such propagation may only happen in lab conditions. These sightings are part of an ongoing effort to showcase katipo to visitors, and with several in the area now, it's easier than ever to share their beauty.

Stop Bathurst's Monster Coal Mine



Bathurst's proposed Denniston coal-for-export mine1 has been listed in the government's dodgy fast-track 'let's-not-think-too-hard-about-this' law. Bathurst wants to mine 20 million tonnes of coking coal around Denniston and the wider Buller area, to export to countries like Japan, India, and China. The application is being rammed through a secret process this year, with communities kept in the dark and denied a voice.2 The fast-track application process is a farce, with decision-makers barred from considering basic environmental and democratic criteria.

There is already enough coal in existing mines to deliver a just transition away from fossil fuels. This single coal mine could belch out carbon pollution on a scale that rivals the entirety of New Zealand's annual emissions – talk about a carbon monster!3 Building this mine would drill holes in the only climate lifeboat we have.
